## What is this project & why is it important?

- Clinical trials in children lead to discoveries that help in developing treatment options for children and youth.
- Researchers publish what the trial was about, what was done, and what they found, but these reports are often missing key information.
- We need to know what information is important to you, so that it can be included in two research reporting guidelines that researchers use when they write their research papers.



## Why should you join the Young Person Reporting Guideline Workshops?

- To tell us what information you want to be included when researchers either explain what they did or the results of the trial.
- Be a part of the decisions about your healthcare and in developing a "reporting guideline" for researchers.

- With lived experience of participating in a pediatric clinical trial; OR
